

TUTORING

The Governing Board expects teachers and other members of the instructional staff to make every effort to resolve students' learning needs at school before recommending that parents/guardians engage a tutor or other professional help. By maintaining a competent, dedicated staff and adequate instructional resources, the Board of Education seeks to minimize the necessity for individual tutoring.

To preclude conflicts of interest, teachers may not accept private remuneration for tutoring a student enrolled in any of their classes. Teachers who tutor other students must perform this service outside school facilities and make their own arrangements with parents/guardians for the fees to be charged.
