### DIFFERENTIAL GRADUATION AND COMPETENCY STANDARDS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Beginning in the 2003-2004 school year, each student completing grade 12 must successfully complete graduation requirements established by the board and must pass the California High School Exit Exam in order to receive a high school diploma. Education code authorizes the board to award a certificate of educational achievement or completion to students with disabilities who do not complete the graduation requirements or do not pass the California High School Exit Exam and who meet the criteria specified below.

The Board of Education establishes the following requirements for the completion of a district alternative course of study and for the granting of a **Certificate of Achievement**:

- 1. Successful completion of a minimum of 230 semester credits
- 2. Successful completion of the specific requirements of a four year plan as indicated below:

(General education course equivalents and Basic Special Education classes may be substituted, as appropriate.)

3. In addition, the student must satisfactorily complete the goals and objectives included in his/her Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and Individualized Transition Plan (ITP), must have satisfactory attendance and must have satisfactorily participated in the class instruction.

Students who have more severe disabilities may be granted a **Certificate of Completion** when they have satisfactorily met goals and objectives during high school as identified in the IEP and have satisfactorily attended school during their educational program, have participated in instruction as prescribed in the IEP (i.e. modification of curriculum in content areas) and have met the objectives of the statement of transition services.

In accordance with Education Code 56391, a student with disabilities who meets the criteria for Certificate of Achievement or Certificate of Completion shall be eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and any school activity related to graduation in which a graduating student of similar age without disabilities would be eligible to participate.
